1. The minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> June 1970 were read and confirmed

2. Playing fields

The Clerk reported that no further communication had been received from the Solicitor, and it was resolved that an enquiry should be made i.e. the stage negotiations had reached.

3. Cricket field footpath.

The findings of the sub committee appointed were put before the meeting. It was resolved that legal action be taken to close the footpath. It is noted however that the Council are not anxious to close footpaths, but in this case where it appears the footpath does not lead anywhere no other action seems appropriate. It was further resolved that a letter be sent to the Cricket Club stating the plan of action.
